Union Action update

As you will be aware, the teaching unions are planning to take industrial action on the morning of Tuesday 21st February. This is <u>not</u> a strike just about Teachers' pay. Teachers are taking strike action because of the cuts to teachers pay and the lack of adequate funding for schools which together are causing a crisis in education for your child.

Funding for schools has <u>not</u>, over the years, been kept in line with rising costs. This means that:

- Many schools face difficulty in the recruitment of staff
- in many cases SEN children are not getting the support they need
- schools are unable to fully fund important equipment and resources
- schools are cutting back on extra-curricular clubs.

If a resolution is not found, the strike action will result in a school closure for the morning of 21st February. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly, but in this instance where staff have elected to take lawful industrial action, schools will have no choice but to take appropriate steps to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of all pupils.

We know that school closures inconvenience parents and so we are giving you advanced notice of the likely impact on our school.

Victoria Primary school, along with most other schools, will be closed to pupils for the morning session on Tuesday 21st February.

Children coming to school for the afternoon session should be in school for lunchtime at 12noon. The afternoon session will run as normal.
